TEACHER-TRAINING WORKSHOPS

GEEA is seeking global partners to develop and deliver economic and financial literacy education. GEEA offers a variety of workshops to train high school teachers (or those who train teachers) to teach economics and financial literacy using interactive, activity-based, classroom-ready materials. Our training team consists primarily of PhD economists from US universities with experience in training, curriculum development and assessment in economics and financial literacy education. We can tailor programs to meet the educational standards of our partner countries. We work with our partners to develop workshops in varying lengths (generally one to five days) on these and related topics:

Economics Training:

Introduction to Economics | Microeconomics | Macroeconomics | International Economics | Entrepreneurship

Financial Literacy Training:

Introduction to Financial Literacy | Earning Income, Education, and Careers | Buying Goods and Services, Decision Making, and Budgeting | Saving and Financial Investing | Credit and Borrowing | Protecting and Insuring

ASSESSMENT, MONITORING AND EVALUATION

GEEA can help partners set up and administer formal and informal assessment programs to evaluate the effects of teacher-training workshops and other programs. Formal assessments include pre and post-testing of program participants and statistical analysis. Longitudinal follow-up studies that trace effects on students may be implemented. Results may be presented as formal reports, conference presentations, and published papers. STUDY TOURS

GEEA works with partners to set up study tours for US teachers of economics and financial literacy to visit schools in partner countries and to share cultural experiences with teachers in these countries. GEEA also hosts economics and financial literacy teachers on study tours from partner countries to the US.
